adjudicators

Richard Yarr MBE MMus (Lond) BMus (Hons) FRSA



Richard Yarr MBE is an award-winning producer, adjudicator and administrator. His work also spans consultancy projects, revitalising organisations of varying size, and his interpersonal skills make him a popular guest speaker at conferences, dinners and educational events.

Richard is a graduate of Queen's University, Belfast, and multi-scholarship winner. He gained a First

Class Honours degree in music (BMus) in 1995 and an MMus from King's College London the following year. As a Choral Scholar at King's he performed with the renowned Chapel Choir for weekly services, in broadcasts, recordings and on tour.

Richard has worked for the BBC since 2000. He is Senior Producer of Arts and Music at BBC Northern Ireland. With a rich knowledge of repertoire, artists and the music industry, he oversees all classical music output from the region. This includes broadcasts of the Ulster Orchestra. In 2015 he created BBC Northern Ireland's highly popular School Choir of the Year Competition and co-ordinated the BBC's national coverage of Derry~Londonderry UK City of Culture in 2013. He has also enjoyed positions with the BBC Singers management team at Maida Vale Studios and with the BBC Proms.

Richard is Chairperson of the Charles Wood Festival of Music & Summer School, a Music Advisor for CCEA (The Council for the Curriculum, Examinations & Assessment, NI) and Director of Music in Belfast's oldest place of worship. He is also Music Fellow at Repton School in Derbyshire and Patron of the Northern Ireland Young Musician of the Year Competition and the Lagan Festival of Speech, Drama, Music & Art.

Richard was awarded Freedom of the City of London in 2019 and Fellowship of the Royal Society of Arts in the same year. He was made a Paul Harris Fellow by Rotary International in October 2021 and in June 2022 Richard was awarded an MBE in the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Birthday Honours for Services to Music in Northern Ireland.

Mr Arthur Webb MA, B.Ed, LRAM, GGSM

After graduating from Queen's University, Belfast with a B.Ed degree in English and Drama, Arthur studied at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, London and subsequently completed an MA in Drama and Media at Ulster University.

He taught in a large grammar school for 25 years where he was Head of the Creative and Expressive faculty. Currently he is Chief Examiner for Drama in Northern Ireland and Examiner for A level Performing Arts with CCEA.



As Arts Education Adviser, Arthur was responsible for introducing Drama to the NI Curriculum as a discrete and statutory subject. As an Associate with the British Federation of International Adjudicating he has adjudicated at many festivals throughout Ireland and the UK. He is also an Examiner with New Era Academy, London and has extensive experience of examining both locally and as far as Hong Kong.

Arthur was Director of the Youth Lyric Theatre, Belfast for 16 years and for many years Drama Coach for children's programmes with the BBC. As a professional theatre director of 5 specially commissioned Shakespeare plays for schools, his work has toured Northern Ireland and Scotland. Arthur has directed a wide range of classical plays, operas and musical theatre and frequently coaches professionals in public speaking.



Mrs Patricia Irvine LGSM, Cert Ed, MSTD

Born in Scotland, Patricia is a graduate of Guildhall and of Stranmillis University College, Belfast and is an Adjudicator-Member of The British and International Federation of Festivals and an Adjudicator Member of the Society of Teachers of Speech and Drama.

Patricia is a speech teacher based in Bangor, County Down, Northern Ireland. As a drama tutor she has presented drama workshops to groups of all ages throughout Northern Ireland.

She has been tutor to North Down Youth Drama, Coordinator of the North Down Summer Dance-Drama Scheme and of the youth programme of the Aspects Celebration of Irish Writing in Bangor. She is past Chairwoman of the Ulster

Association of Youth Drama. For several years she worked as a primary school teacher.

Patricia's productions have won numerous national and international drama festivals and have appeared at the Royal National Theatre and in Europe, Asia and the USA. A member of Actors Equity, she has appeared on stage, television and radio and she has worked as tutor with BBC Television in Ireland, England and Scotland.

Patricia has been involved in the Festival Movement since an early age as competitor, teacher, administrator and Adjudicator. She has adjudicated numerous festivals throughout Ireland, England and Scotland and in Sri Lanka and Hong Kong.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals (including Dungannon Music and Drama Festival), are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

CREATING SAFER FESTIVALS FOR EVERYONE

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create Safer Festivals for everyone:

- 1.A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2.One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival. Name: Ms Vi Leckey Phone: 028 8772 2686
- 3.Best practice advice in the form of Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection leaflets, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4.Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending/performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5.All Festival personnel wear an official name badge. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition, we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6.For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate

their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take responsibility for any property left unattended.

- 7.No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- 8.Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case, we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Organisers at the time of entry. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support – or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 9.The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and Website. By completing and signing the entry form (or ticking the box for online entries) all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of competitors under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the competitors to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.

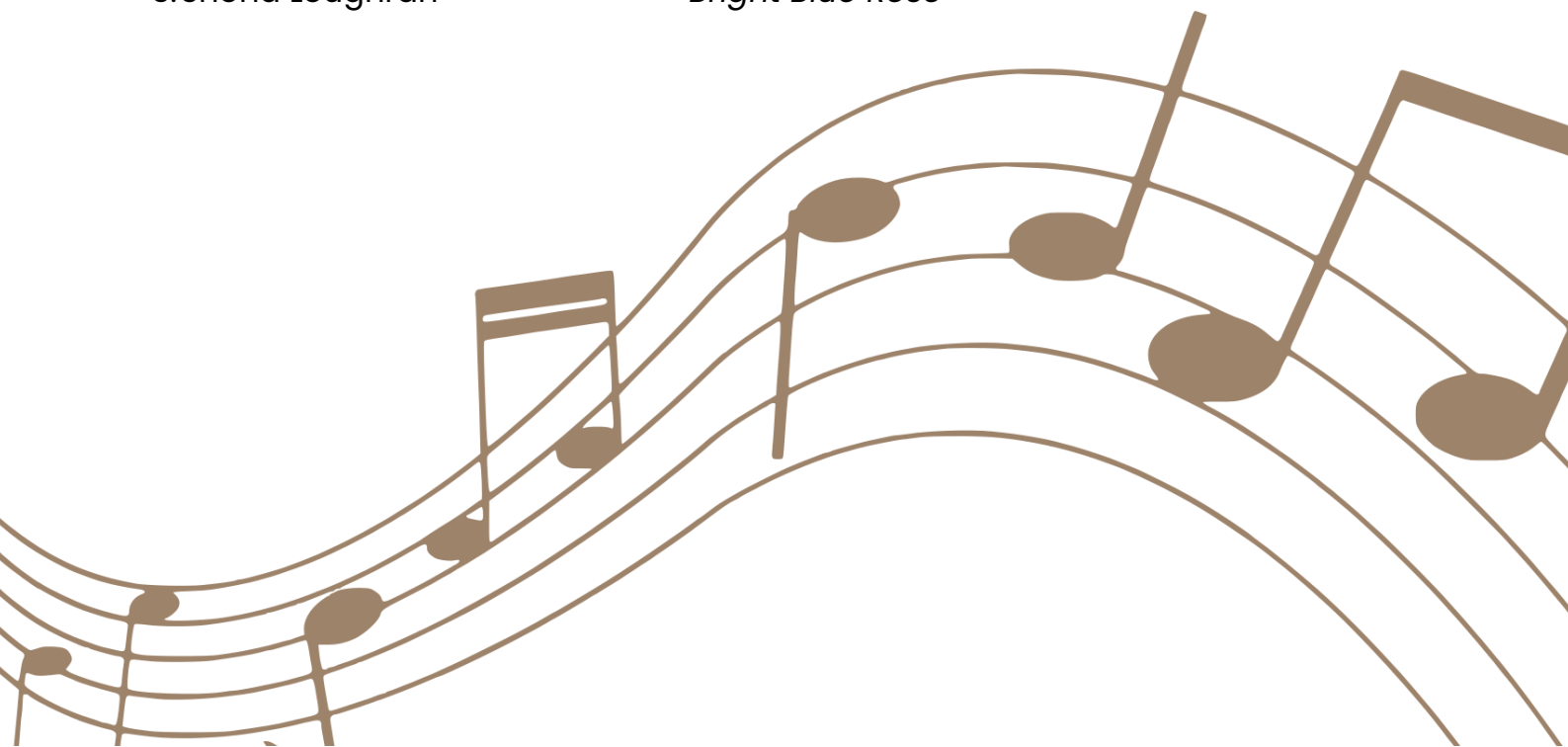
